

Tobacco Use Demographics - Collier 2021




In Collier County, non-Hispanic white men, ages 45-64 are most likely to be tobacco users [1].

Across Florida, adults who are current smokers have been decreasing each year, with 2021 marking the lowest total current smokers at 13% [1].


Figure 2-Deaths from Tobacco-Related Cancers







Fortunately, Collier County has been reducing the total number of deaths from tobacco-related cancers. In 2021, the rate per 100,000 deaths from tobaccorelated cancer aged 35 and older in Collier County was 135.7 versus 153 across Florida [2]. Figure 1-Adults Who are Current Smokers in Florida





Deaths from oral cancer have been on the rise in Collier County, with the rate in 2021 being 2.5 per 100,000 deaths, compared to 0.9 in 2018 [3].

The rate of lung cancer incidence per 100,000 in Collier County has been declining, with a rate of 32.7 reported in 2020 compared to 39.0 in 2019 [4].

Figure 3-Students Who Have Ever Tried Cigarettes, Cigars, or Smokeless Tobacco





Figure 4-Students Who Are Users of Tobacco Products Whose Parents Do Not Know They Use Tobacco



In 2022 in Collier County, 65.3% of students are users of tobacco products whose parents do not know that they use tobacco, as compared to 60.8% statewide [6].

Recent data suggests that the total number of students who have ever tried cigarettes, cigars, or smokeless tobacco continues to decline over the years, citing 9.3% of Collier County students have tried the aforementioned products in 2022, compared to 33.5% in 2010 [5].



In 2022, males made up 60% of student tobacco users in Collier County whose parents do not know they use tobacco & females made up 73.1% [6].



Teens are more sensitive to nicotine and feel dependent on nicotine sooner than adults [10].

A single nicotine refill pod contains as much nicotine as a pack of 20 regular cigarettes [10].
